She holds a BA in Creative Writing from Columbia College Chicago, and lives on the northwest side of the city with her girlfriend, Nikki, contending that Albany Park is positioning itself to be the *new* Andersonville. They share three frisky felines.

Robert McDonald has lived as an out gay man in Chicago for over 15 years, 8 of which have been serving on the front lines of Chicago's gay community as a bookseller at Unabridged Bookstore. A self-described "theater-going, movie-watching, bar-hopping type-of-guy" when he's not out in the field observing queer culture, McDonald can be found with his nose in a book or his pen on a page. He is an avid reader and a published poet. His writing has appeared in *Publishers Weekly*, *Stagebill*, and the *Chicago Reader*, along with several very highbrow-type literary journals.
