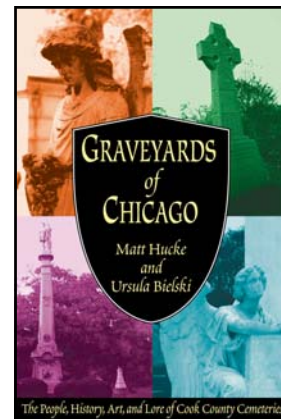

Matt Hucke, a native of southern Illinois, has resided in Chicago since 1993 and has been exploring its fascinating graveyards since 1995. In August, 1996, Hucke created the website, Graveyards of Chicago, that inspired this book at www.graveyards.com. His site has received several awards, including the “4 Stone” award for superior cemetery-related websites. It has grown to include thousands of photographs of an expanding list of area cemeteries. Hucke’s graveyard images have appeared in the *Washington Post*, the *American Girls News*, and both editions of Ursula Bielski’s *Chicago Haunts*, and have been used online by the Chicago Historical Society and the *San Diego Union-Tribune*. He lives in Rogers Park, north of his favorite Chicago graveyard, Rosehill. He works as an independent Unix programmer and consultant.

Historian, author, and parapsychology enthusiast **Ursula Bielski** has been writing and lecturing about Chicago’s supernatural folklore and the paranormal for more than 16 years. She is a recognized authority on the Chicago region’s ghostlore and cemetery history. Bielski has been featured on several television documentaries, including productions by the A&E Network, The History Channel, The Learning Channel, The Travel Channel, and PBS. She also appears regularly on local Chicago television and radio, and lectures throughout the year at various libraries, historical and professional societies. Ursula lives in Chicago with her two daughters. She also owns the Chicago Hauntings tour and special events company.
