Founded by Sharon Woodhouse in 1994, Lake Claremont Press has published 30 titles, including local bestseller *Chicago Haunts: Ghostlore of the Windy City* and award-winners *Hollywood on Lake Michigan: 100 Years of Chicago and the Movies*, *The Chicago River: A Natural and Unnatural History*, *Near West Side Stories: Struggles for Community in Chicago's Maxwell Street Neighborhood*, *Finding Your Chicago Ancestors: A Beginner's Guide to Family History in the City and Cook County*, *A Cook's Guide to Chicago*, *The Politics of Place: A History of Zoning in Chicago*, *A Field Guide to Gay and Lesbian Chicago*, and *The Streets & San Man's Guide to Chicago Eats*. We will release eleven new books in 2008 and are working on our first Spanish translation, two new product lines, and titles that cover aspects of Chicago social history, police culture, maritime history, music, and African-American neighborhoods.
